Defending freedom and saving lives in Ukraine

Spirit of America has delivered more than 200 tons of lifesaving protective aid to Ukrainians soldiers and civilian volunteers on the front lines. Working closely with our US and Ukrainian military partners, we have provided:

- 18,594 ballistic helmets and bulletproof vests
- 21,015 first aid kits and advanced trauma kits
- 33,000 ready-to-eat meals
- Satellite phones and other communications gear
- Winter clothing
- Pickup trucks, 50-passenger buses, and funding for the repair of military trucks
- Seed funding for a training course for civilian volunteers in the Territorial Defense Force
- Support for over 1,000 refugees in Poland, including families of Ukrainian soldiers



Spirit of America and members of our team have been recognized by the Ukrainian Ministry of Defense with awards for our assistance to Ukrainian troops.

Mobilizing citizen preparedness in Taiwan

Citizen participation is essential to Taiwan's ability to protect its freedom and democracy if there is a crisis. To support US-Taiwan relations, Spirit of America is building a network of citizens that are trained and equipped to respond to a disaster or emergency. We are helping local civil society organizations expand their training programs, and we're providing gear to ensure citizens can maintain communication outside Taiwan. We are also supporting first responders and working with the National Fire Agency to pilot country-wide civilian response teams.



Building stability and hope in Mozambique



In northern Mozambique, 800,000 people are displaced from their homes due to attacks by an Islamic State insurgent group. Working with the US Embassy, Spirit of America has provided jobs to rebuild schools and civic buildings and is making villages there a better, safer place to live. The progress and momentum are helping prevent a resurgence of the terrorist group.
