Saving and improving lives in Ukraine

In partnership with the US military, Spirit of America has delivered \$55 million and 800 tons in nonlethal aid to the front lines in Ukraine. Our assistance protects, and increases the effectiveness of, Ukrainian soldiers that have the most asymmetric impact on defending Ukraine against Russian aggression. In 2023, we provided:

- Mobile phones and tablets to get a secure communication network up and running that has eliminated over \$3.5 billion in deadly Russian systems, saving lives
- 111 surveillance drones
- · 262 military trucks repaired and deployed
- 85 4x4 pickups, vans, and SUVs
- · High-priority needs for elite military units

To address the devastating impact of Russia's war on Ukrainian students, Spirit of America developed and funded a new program, UActive, in partnership with the Ukrainian nonprofit savED. UActive students are learning the skills and getting the financial support necessary to rebuild their schools and communities.

Supporting the future of Afghan refugees



To continue our commitment to Afghans following the 2021 crisis, Spirit of America is working with US embassy teams and

local partners to promote the education of 3,000 displaced Afghans in Iraq, Qatar, Lebanon, Tajikistan, Kyrgyzstan, and Kazakhstan, and support their transition to permanent countries. Our Afghan Future Campaign is supporting educational programs and tutoring services, organizing professional development retreats, and arranging cultural experiences to improve mental health.
